We saw a very healthy number of candidates for the Steering Committee elections this year: three for the government constituency, four for the business constituency and nine for the individual constituency.

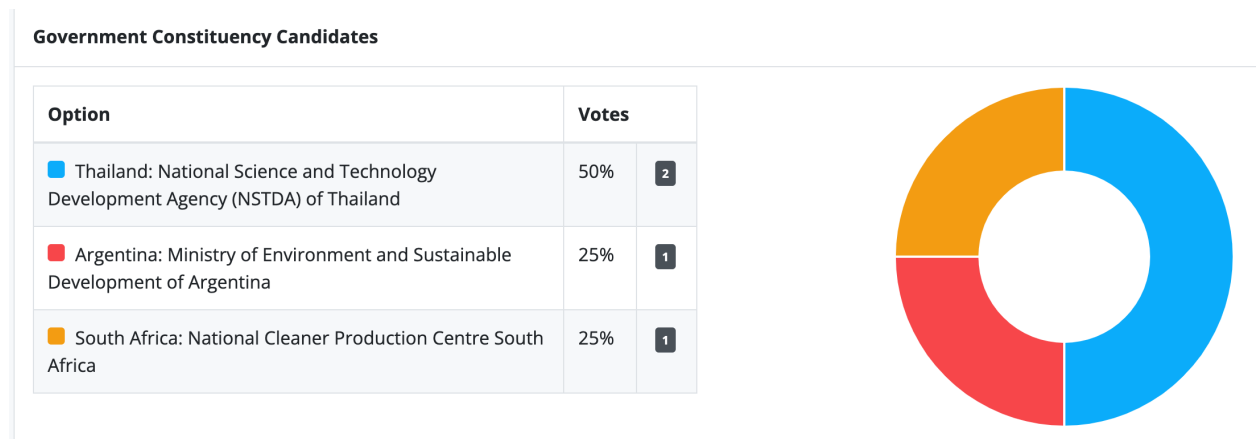

Results for the Government constituency (1 seat)

Three candidates presented for election. With 17% participation of all eligible voters, the new elected government representative to the Steering Committee is:

- National Science and Technology Development Agency (NSTDA) representing the Government of Thailand

The Steering Committee government representatives for 2021-2022 cycle are:

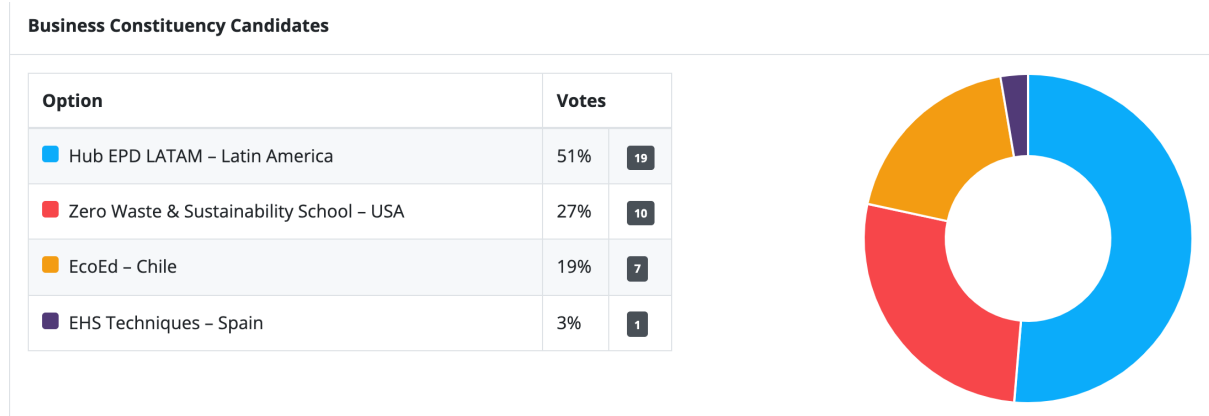
- NSTDA- Government of Thailand (Asia Pacific) [mandate until 2024]
- European Commission – DG Environment (Europe) [mandate until 2023]
- United States – Department of Agriculture (USDA-ARS-NAL) [mandate until 2022]

Results for the Business constituency (1 seat)

Four candidates presented for election. With 55% participation of all eligible voters, the new re-elected government representative to the Steering Committee is:

- HUB EPD LATAM

The Steering Committee government representatives for 2021-2022 cycle are:

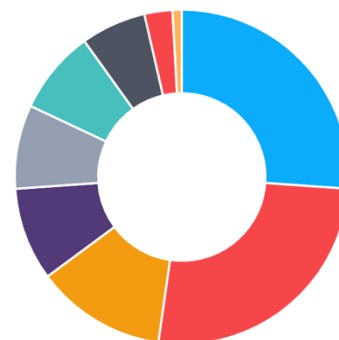
- The HUB EPD of Latin America "HUB EPD LATAM" (Latin America and Caribbean) [mandate until 2024].

Results for the Science and Civil Society constituency (Individual) (1 seat)

First ballot ends in a tie



Nine candidates presented for the open seat. Each eligible member cast one vote. This constituency saw a bit more drama in the process, as we had a tie between two candidates.

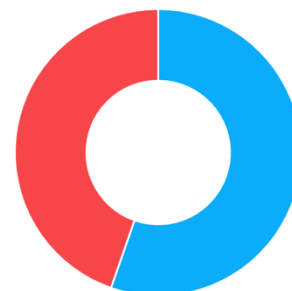

Run-off ballot

The tie was resolved in a second round of voting between the two co-winners of the first election, with the following results...

Option	Votes	
 Nasser Ayoub – Egypt	55%	57
 Marcelo Langer, Ph.D. – Brazil	45%	46



The new elected representative to the Steering Committee for this constituency is:

- Nasser Ayoub, Egypt (Africa)

This is a notable result for the Life Cycle Initiative as Nasser Ayoub becomes our first Steering Committee representative from the region of Africa.
